It was just over a year ago that the Covid-19 pandemic began. In that time, many lives have been lost, many have become ill, and many people have experienced so many changes in their lives that it will take years to achieve a new sense of normal. With a small portion of our population already vaccinated, many are sensing that the light is appearing at the end of a very long tunnel, much like the lighted Easter Candle being carried into the darkened church on the night of the Easter Vigil! “Christ our Light” sings the minister as the light of new life and hope is shared among the people, eventually bringing light to all present! It has been a most challenging year here at the Basilica. Our savings are nearly depleted, even after severe staff reductions. Without the pilgrims and tourists who usually participate in our life here, the weekly collections provide only about 30% of the necessary revenue. We are most ardently seeking the Blessed Mother’s intercession to provide that which is necessary for our expenses and ministry. It may take many, many years for us to recover; but, I trust that the Lord will provide and that he will inspire the faithful to a greater sense of generosity and kindness!

While it might seem that this pandemic is a great part of our shared history, the most amazing event in all of history is Jesus’ resurrection from the dead! While the sting of death has touched us all, our Easter celebration reminds us of God’s dominion over all things, and the resurrection banishes the last stronghold, even death itself!

The empty tomb gives us the confidence to say, with Mary, that “my soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord!”

As in every Christian Church and community throughout the world, Easter at the Basilica is a beautiful sign of light and hope, most especially for those with troubled hearts. In our encounter with the Risen Lord, and with the tender embrace of his most Blessed Mother, we share Easter light and hope with others!

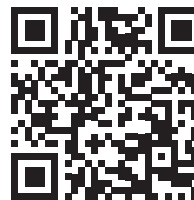
