or sitting quietly and meditating in the outdoor Mother and Child Chapel. The loving presence of God is felt at the Shrine, as well as the maternal affection

of Mary, the Mother of Jesus. Visitors tell us they find comfort as they gaze on the serene faces of Jesus and Mary on our signature statue of *Mary*, *Queen of the Universe*, sculpted by Jill Burkee. Young people are affected too by the bright, alert, smiling face of the teenage Jesus, talking with his foster-father, Joseph, portrayed in the magnificent bronze work by the artist Bruno Lucchesi.

The priests who minister at the Shrine continue to be edified by the exemplary generosity and Christian charity of so many Shrine "volunteers", without whose assistance this ministry of Eucharistic Hospitality would be impossible. Many, many visitors participate and share in the Shrine ministry of "bringing Christ to the people" by their gifts and financial



There's an old Irish song that begins with the words "It seems like only yesterday..." Time passes so quickly! Truly it seems like only yesterday since we initiated the Tourist Ministry with our first Mass in a hotel ballroom.

We had entrusted the work to the Mother of the Lord. We were providing her Divine Son in Eucharist to the many visitors who would soon crowd hotel ballrooms - and at times! - hotel bars, in their search for Eucharist.

The years went by. We had a dream. We envisioned the future and a fitting place of worship for our faithful people. Once, when we apologized for asking for help during a Mass, a lady responded, almost automatically, with words that became encased in my memory. "You don't need to apologize, Father," she said, "We know there is need for a Church. We will help you."

And so we progressed into our first Shrine "Mass center." It was a humble building but it was ours. It housed around 700 persons. Seven years later we completed the Shrine Church. Bishop Dorsey presided at the first Mass celebrated there. It was a celebration of joy!

Joy overflowed at the dedication of the Shrine on August 22, 1993. Our own Bishop Dorsey called the Shrine "the house that faith built." He was referring to the many visitors who had sacrificed that a suitable place of worship be provided. And Pio Cardinal Laghi referenced "the dream" that began it all!

Speaking of Mary's Shrine as a beautiful dream that became ever more real because of friends like you who share in this holy ministry, the Cardinal said: "Father Harte, I think it is better that you continue to dream."

And I pray you will continue to dream with me all through the months and years to come. Great things lie ahead that we can accomplish together for the Lord and His wonderful Mother!

Lourdes Novena and Pilgrimage

It was on Feb. 11th, 1858 that the Blessed Virgin first appeared to Bernadette Soubirous, a poor, semi-illiterate, 14-year old girl. Over the next five months, the Blessed Virgin appeared 17 more times. The "Beautiful Lady" carried a rosary and identified herself with the words "I am the Immaculate Conception."

In 1907, Pope St. Pius X extended the local feast of the apparitions of the Blessed Mother to the Universal Church. Today, Lourdes counts upwards of six million pilgrims each year.

Mary's presence has most certainly brought peace to uncounted numbers of pilgrims journeying there over time.

Many people would like to make a pilgrimage to Lourdes but are unable to do so for a variety of reasons.



Novena - February 11 - 19, 2003







PLANNED ENTRANCE PORTALS AT MARY, QUEEN OF THE UNIVERSE SHRINE







The Shrine's planned entrance portals will be visual landmarks. They will represent thematically; the *Old Testament*, the New Testament and the Living Church. Large scale, vividly crafted mosaics will adorn the archway space above the portals extending a welcome to God's faithful as they approach the building. The plan calls for each element, from sculpted panels and mosaics to bronze statuary and

roundels, to be commissioned, crafted and fitted into place only after the cost is underwritten by one or more donors.

Pilgrimage, Marian Sanctuaries and Spiritual Renewal

(Excerpts from an address by Pope John Paul II to Rectors of Marian Shrines.)

he New Code of Canon Law underscores the importance and value of sanctuaries in the lives of Christians (cf. Canon 1230-34) and summarizes their pastoral program.

"At Shrines, the means of salvation are to be more abundantly made available to the faithful; by sedulous proclamation of the Word of God, by suitable encouragement of liturgical life, especially by the celebration of the Eucharist and penance, and by the fostering of approved forms of popular devotion" (Canon. 1234. par. 1).


Marian Shrines should be temples of God, where the faithful can experience the supernatural in a special way; where they receive a catechesis, which is solid and conducive to their formation; a catechesis fully integrated into the gospel message and illuminated by the perennial Magisterium of the Church; where finally, through the Sacrament of Penance, spiritual direction and Eucharistic Communion, they draw abundantly from the wellsprings of grace and divine consolation, in order to be ready to face life's difficulties and

to witness courageously to the Christian faith, each in his own social environment.

Each Sanctuary is a house of
Mary, a dwelling place of faith,
where the Lord is constantly
welcomed by the Virgin and
ceaselessly given to the world.
Pilgrims journey there with sure
intuition, seeking "in Mary's
faith, a support for their own"
(cf Redemptoris Mater, 27).
Entering her house they always
find, like the Magi, "the child
with Mary his Mother" (Matt.
2:11), and prostrating themselves,
they adore him.

This experience of God must not, however, end in the sanctuary; it must be a radical turning point, initiating a new course of witness in everyday life.

"Scripture itself invites us to interpret Pilgrimage in this way. It presents Pilgrimage to a Sanctuary as a decisive point in one's spiritual life (cf Deut. 16:10), as a joyous community experience (cf Ps. 84:122) in which Jesus, too, participated annually with his parents (cf Luke, 2:41-42). It leads one before the Lord, to seek his face, to experience the joy of his face, to experience the joy of his house, which prefigures that eschatological day when one will enjoy unending happiness in the beatific vision."

To be remembered within the Shrine Church is a special honor. And donors who elect this commemorative will have their name, or the name of a designated loved one, engraved on a plaque which will be permanently installed in the pew.

BRONZE PORTAL MEMORIAL
