### The Bishops





### Bishop Thomas Wenski




### The Dreamers

## A LETTER FROM THE RECTOR



Dear Friend of Mary's Shrine,

I remember it well ... a small banquet room in a local hotel, 200 people or so, a somewhat "hesitant" priest for mass with five or six industrious helpers.

It was early times! My Bishop had given me carte blanche to have masses for tourists in any location I could find. In my mind there were questions aplenty ... could we make this infant Tourist Ministry survive? How might we get the word out? ... Would visitors come to the hotels for masses? How many masses? Where to find further help? Yes, and what to do when the customary hotel where we offered mass called off the arrangement because there was no room in the inn? And would there be sufficient monetary help to

keep going?

I began the mass by welcoming the people as I always did ... perhaps a comment here and there on the success (or failure, perish the thought!) of Notre Dame or some other noted football university! Then one Saturday I made a mistake a funds raiser must never make! I apologized that I had to ask for generosity in the offerings.

Then I heard a woman's voice. "Father, I want to say something." She was sitting in the fourth row of chairs and her interruption temporarily frightened me. But reassurance came quickly. "Father," she said, "you don't have to apologize for anything. We know the need and we are glad you are here." "Aren't we glad?" she continued, turning to the others. And the response came in a burst of applause.

God works in His own good ways! He had sent me a message; asking to further His work was worthy, and His good people's love for the Eucharist was away and beyond any earthly values.

And so a rejuvenated priest began to make stronger and more effective appeals. From every state in the land people came on board to help ... more and more helping volunteers joined in the ministry ... the ministry did not only survive -- it thrived! Volunteers spread the word to hotels, we found more priests to help with extra masses at more venues! And the Lord sent us wonderful benefactors -- like you -- to further His cause in this tourist area.

Remember Saint Peter! (His statue is under construction and will soon stand within our Church.) His enthusiasm for Jesus was always expressed in the high moments of his life with the words "It is the Lord." Like him we profess that it is the Lord who is the energizer. Thank you for helping to light His path!

Like Mary, to whose gentle hands we have committed this ministry, let us always "Do what he tells you." With Mary we know the Shrine will continue to be a beacon of light in Orlando for visitors and residents alike.

I never did get the name of the lady who spoke up at that mass. To this day she remains anonymous. But she is in my heart and I pray for her frequently. Her simple act benefited not only my life but the lives of countless thousands. And your encouragement and sacrificial gifts achieve the same result.

They dreamed of a place "like no other." They knew it could be done because "nothing is impossible with God." (Luke 1:37)

In Orlando, a gathering place

for millions of tourists – a place with a theme park whose signature tune was known in every continent – "It's a small, small world" – those enthusiastic S.W. Orlando residents would create a more significant kind of music. The song they would sing would be "Jesus Christ!"

As the number of visiting tourists grew, so also did the number of "dreamers." The enthusiasm spread. "Volunteers" dreamed with

each other and the visitors whom they served. From approximately 8 to 10 volunteers at the start, the numbers grew to upwards of 300 dedicated, loving, Christcentered people. And with the increasing influx of tourists came those who shared the "Dream" and realized not only the need for a Catholic place of worship serving visitors to the major theme parks, but also a special place of Catholic witness in the capital of the tourist world.

### Honorees

At this banquet we honor our entire Shrine family – our volunteers who come to serve, our visitors who come to be served, and a "Community of Faith" known as the Mary, Queen of the Universe Shrine Family that as a result has developed throughout the United States and in regions far beyond.

Years ago Pope John Paul II met with the then Father Harte and promised to remember in prayer all who would share in the development of Mary, Queen of the Universe Shrine. (A bust of Pope John Paul II is in the Shrine's Rosary Garden.)



"I offer my blessing upon this holy work. I will include you and all Shrine benefactors in my daily prayers." Pope John Paul II.




Today, as we celebrate a "Dream

### Ministry's success attributed to the laity

From the beginning, Father Harte believed that God's work needed the faithful hands of the laity.

"It is the people, the laity, that have made this a successful ministry. Jesus gave the bread to his followers to distribute, he didn't distribute them himself.
Our bodies are his body. We are very much a part of the mystery of the Body of Christ and we work with Him and through Him. Our volunteers understand that and that is the reason our ministry has been so successful." (Excerpts from the Florida Catholic newspaper, August 13, 1993)

Father Harte and a handful of volunteers began to minister to the multitudes of tourists at Disney World after its opening in 1971. Attendance of worshippers grew from a handful at the Twin Towers Hotel to many thousands. The ministry moved to larger hotels – from the Sheraton to the Travelodge, to the Royal Plaza Hotel, the Hilton, the Palace Hotel, and eventually to the Polynesian on Disney property.

After the completion of Holy
Family Parish where he was
the founding pastor, Father
Harte went from house to house
recruiting Catholics for Holy
Family parish and also to recruit
volunteers to help with the
ministry at the hotels.

God blessed the ministry and now the Diocese of Orlando has a magnificent church, a seat of evangelization, a beacon of faith to the world, a monument to honor Mary, the Mother of God, and a spiritual oasis where hundreds of thousands of worshippers from all over the world receive Eucharistic food and life. In addition, the Shrine dispenses Christ's healing peace to thousands of visitors through the sacrament of reconciliation which is available every day.

With us tonight are members of the Shrine "family" from Florida itself and from Michigan, Colorado, Massachusetts, Virginia, Ireland, New York, New Jersey, West Virginia, California, and places equally distant. These wonderful people love the Shrine because they love the Blessed Mother and they love the Shrine's evangelization.





The Rising Christ

Suspended at the rear of the nave of the Shrine Church is a 14 foot high lindenwood statue of the *Rising Christ*. Here is Jesus – seeming to emerge from a burial shroud with "one hand reaching down to us and the other, raising upward to the Father." The image invites us to come through Him to the Father. When you leave the Shrine Church, you do so with a sense of optimism as you notice the *Rising Christ*.

You, the members of the "Shrine family" are invited by the Lord to continue to help bring others, with yourself, to the Father, with the help of the Blessed Mother.

# To be Forever Remembered in the Life of this Holy Apostolate, this 'House of Pilgrimage'

Mary, Queen of the Universe Shrine provides a wide range of opportunities for Christ's faithful to be remembered, in perpetuity, within this holy apostolate designated by Pope John Paul II as: "a house of pilgrimage."



### FOOTSTEPS OF FAITH
