About the Artists

Cited by the Rochester *Democrat and Chronicle* as a "local prodigy," **DR. JOSEPH IRRERA** has concertized across the globe including appearances at Carnegie Hall, The Kennedy Center, and Spivey Hall. At the age of 18 he made his debut as guest soloist with the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra performing Rachmaninoff's Second Piano Concerto.

Joseph completed his Bachelor's Degree in Performance at the Eastman School of Music in 2005. He earned his Master's Degree in Piano Performance in 2007 from the Peabody Conservatory and went on to complete the Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in 2014 at the Eastman School of Music in Piano Performance and Literature, with a minor in Pedagogy.

In addition to his solo piano concert engagements, Joseph is also very active as a chamber musician appearing with his brother, violinist Dr. John Irrera. The internationally acclaimed Irrera Brothers Piano & Violin Duo has appeared throughout the United States, Europe, and Central America. They made their Carnegie Hall Debut in 2009 and were invited back in 2012 and again in 2013.

As a recording artist, Joseph can be heard on albums featuring the Irrera Brothers Duo including "Beethoven & Prokofiev" (2012), "Vitali" (2014), and "Complete Works for Violin and Piano by Robert Morris", released in 2019 on the Centaur Records label. He has also recorded solo piano works of Scarlatti, Schumann, and Chopin for Steinway & Sons (2015). Joseph is laureate of many national and international piano competitions including the Guthman International Piano Competition in Atlanta, Georgia, the Young Artists International Piano Competition, and the American Protégé International Piano Competition in New York City.

DR. WILLIAM PICHER, was born to a musical family in Portland, Maine, and began taking organ lessons at the age of 7 with his father, Frank Picher. At age 13, he began to study trumpet and has continued playing both instruments throughout his career. He holds degrees from the University of Maine, Eastman School of Music and Catholic University of America and has served as Director of Music/Organist at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception (Portland, Maine), the Cathedral of St. Jude the Apostle (St. Petersburg, Florida) as well as a trumpet instrumentalist in the famed United States Navy Band in Washington DC where he toured throughout the U.S. and performed in many ceremonies at the White House, Pentagon and Arlington National Cemetery. In 2000, Bill was awarded the St. Jude Medal by Bishop Robert Lynch in recognition for his service to the Cathedral of St. Jude the Apostle and the Diocese of St. Petersburg. Never a fan of cold weather, Bill is happy to reside in Florida, where he and his wife of 42 years have raised two sons, both of whom have gone on to pursue careers in the arts.

The Peter Nero Piano



The late two-time Grammy Award-winning pianist and Steinway Artist Peter Nero has been hailed as one of the premier interpreters of Gershwin. With an additional ten Grammy nominations, the Washington Post has called him "the epitome of the Pops Conductor/ Performer."

Mr. Nero's recording career spanned nearly 60 years and produced 70 recordings. In 1960 he was signed to a three-year contract with RCA Victor records, which was then renewed for another five years, producing more than 26 LPs, including Gershwin's Rhapsody in Blue and Piano Concerto in F with Arthur Fiedler and the Boston Pops. In 1961, he won his first Grammy, "Best New Artist of the Year."

Peter Nero's first major national TV success came at age 17 when he was chosen to perform "Rhapsody in Blue" on a TV special hosted by Paul Whiteman. He subsequently appeared on many top variety and talk shows, including 11 guest appearances on The Ed Sullivan Show and numerous appearances on The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson.

Dr. Irrera is performing tonight on Mr. Nero's personal Steinway concert grand, courtesy of Steinway Piano Gallery Orlando.


